I want to thank all of you who attended my Homecoming—it will be a precious memory to me in the years to come.


Commander Fred and I were both in Veterans Day parades and festivities in Elkins and Clarksburg—and yes, we were "branded"!

Mandatory Funds are Bonding, Department Scholarship, Girls State Project, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order & 10% Poppy Proceeds. Make check payable to Department Treasurer, ALA. DUE into Department July 31st to be a Unit in good standing.

Processing Membership:

Make sure your membership is into Department Headquarters by the 15th to be counted for Targets.

Membership:

All applications must have signature of a Post Officer and if they are a Junior member a Birthdate. Unit Membership Chairman should check each application to make sure it is filled out completely including City, Post #, State and zip code. If eligibility is under a Veteran living all information must be filled out before processing into Department Headquarters. If a veteran is living they must hold membership in The American Legion. All unfinished applications will be returned this year. I am receiving too many mistakes on applications. Please check the Birthdates of your Juniors renewing this year. If they will turn 18 years old by December 31, 2014 they are considered a Senior Member. I have had a few Units who has a Debit for this reason.

Remember: if a Woman Veteran joins the Auxiliary under herself you must put on the application at the top "Honor Our Women Veterans" to get the discount from National. Unit Secretary can sign these applications ONLY

Our Membership is looking a little better, but we still have 2 zero Units. Districts, please contact these Units to see if they may need some help.


I want to congratulate the following Units for making Target #4 at 70%:


I also attended President Paula's Homecoming and this was the first one I have gone to. Again, I learned some new things from this.

Are you aware that the National American Legion Auxiliary offers a Non-Traditional Student Scholarship to 5 members of the American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, or the Sons of the American Legion every year? This scholarship is designed to help the American Legion Family members pursue a college education later in life or to continue their studies that may have been interrupted. This allows one to stay competitive in today's work force. A \$2,000 scholarship is awarded annually per Auxiliary division. Applicant may be pursuing training in a certified, trade, professional, or technical program, or a two-year or four-year degree program. Applicants must be members of the American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary or the Sons of the American Legion and have dues paid for the current year and two preceding years.
