For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens. mentor youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

Mandatory Funds: Bonding, Education, Girls State, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppy Order, and 10% Poppies Proceeds. They are due each year by July 31st to be a Unit in good year. Make checks payable to "Department Treasurer, ALA" Units that haven't paid their 2015 Mandatory Funds are: Mannington Unit #40, Lewisburg Unit #69. All mandatory funds must be paid by July 31st each year to be a unit in good standing. If you are attending convention must be paid by June 10th.

Membership: All applications must be signed by Post Adj. (NOT MEMBER OR SECRETARY). Only exception is if a female veteran joining the Auxiliary under herself. THEN the Secretary may sign the application. National is waiving the \$9.00 fee again this year for New Female Veterans. You must put "Honor Our Women Veterans" at top of application to get the credit for your Unit.

Applications: Please make sure they are filled out completely before sending in. Too many mistakes are being made and unit membership chairman are not catching them.

On February 1st if you send in dues for 2015 only, they will be counted for 2016 year. This comes from National.

Please limit your article to no more than 250 words as you have only one **column to use.** Spirit is limited to 20 pages (including front and back) to send. At times I have to add different pages (ex. quarterly reports, forms, etc.)

May 24, 1844, Samuel Morse sent the first official telegraph message, "What hath God wrought?" from the Capitol building in Washington, D.C. to Baltimore.

Constitution & Bylaws

Here is some items that can be moved to Standing Rules – Unit's membership dues, and time and place of unit meeting. Another suggestion is that your annual membership dues not be a set amount. Here is wording you might want to think about – The annual membership dues of the Unit shall not be less than the Department and National per capita, nor exceed (a dollar amount \$5.00, \$10.00) of the amount payable after the Department Convention. If you word it this way you would be able to change your dues without have to change your bylaws or standing rules. Just a thought.


Parliamentary Points to Ponder

There will be many votes taken at unit meeting during the next few months. This is a reminder for how to handle a motion effectively.

Summary of Steps in Handling a Motion

- 1. A member rises and addresses the presiding officer.
- 2. The presiding officer recognizes the member.
- 3. The member states the motion.
- 4. Another member seconds the motion.
- 5. The presiding officer restates the motion, thus placing it before the assembly for consideration.
- 6. The assembly may discuss the motion if it is debatable and amend the motion if it is amendable.
- 7. The presiding officer takes the vote.
- 8. The presiding officer announces the result.

Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation

From the April Newsletter of the Central Division Chairman, I wish to share with you.

In 2010 President Barack Obama made a commitment to end veterans homelessness by 2015. The Administration released Opening Doors, the nation's first ever strategic plan to prevent and end homelessness. The plan focused on collaboration with state and local government, service organizations, individuals, philanthropic partners, Congress and others to end homelessness, The American Legion Homeless Veterans Task Force put together a step by step guide to coordinate efforts within communities to end homelessness. (www.legion.org/documents.pdf/homelessguide.pdf)

As of this date there has been some success in reducing homelessness among veterans. The governors of Virginia and Connecticut have reported they have ended homelessness in their states. Their success is attributed not only the commitment of the communities but collaboration with housing department, veterans affairs and shelters and communities and working the following strategies;

Navigation teams - Outreach Teams in the communities identify the homeless veterans and work with veterans to get the documents they need to obtain housing and services .

Housing First Models - Focus on providing housing and then connect them with additional services such as case management and substance abuse counseling and job training. This has proven to be cost-effective. With housing and support services there is a reduction of homeless veterans utilizing hospital emergency rooms, jails and shelters.

Rapid Re-Housing - working with rental agencies and landlord mediation to keep veterans housed.




