Those participating in the call beside me were Dept. 1st VP, Lisa Cadwallder, Dept. 2nd VP, Rhonda Best, and Central Division Membership Chairman, Jacquelynn Boughner.

During this call my eyes were definitely opened to all our membership possibilities.

First I like to congratulate the units that participated in recruiting 161 new members.

I also learned that as January 15, 2017 the Department of West Virginia has 4684 paid members for 2017. We also have 3140 UNPAID members. There is another 588 members that haven't paid since 2014 and 2320 have not paid since 2011. Now ladies I've never been super good with math but it's easy for me to see that the Department of West Virginia has over 10,000 members on our membership roster. I would like to offer the membership team to help any unit wanting our assistance.

I'm putting out a challenge to all units: Any unit rejoining 20 members from the 2011 list (with documentation) will receive a gift from the membership team.

One little thing to think about, February 14 Valentine's Day, giving your sweetheart a PUFL to show your love for our veterans.

January 15 "Button" report 60%, 17 units met that percentage and another 17 units 50% or more. This shows that we have lots of members out there working on membership.

I hope everyone has plans to attend Midwinter in Martinsburg February 3-4. At the luncheon on Saturday February 4 we'll be judging the most authentic dressed "Rosie" and "Farmerett". This should be a fun day. Looking forward to seeing each one of you.

As we begin 2017, let us remember how important goodwill should be in our organization.


