<u>Mandatory Funds:</u> to be a unit in good standing one of the obligations is paying your unit mandatory funds yearly, no later than **July 31, 2019**. If you are attending Department Convention to be seated as a delegate, then it is **30 days before Convention.**

Mandatory Funds are: *Bonding, Girls State Project, Education, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppies, and 10% proceeds.*

Many of our members felt encouraged to offer their time and talents to make a positive impact by acting on our motto of "Service, Not Self." March is a marvelous time to give the gift of hope to our Legion family members in need. Donating to the American Legion Auxiliary Emergency Fund provides relief in the most stressful of situations. Your support is critical for families facing weather related disasters like fires, floods, lack of food and other financial hardships. The ALA Fund also assists with education and vocational training to provide a better economic future for our members and their families. ALA members who have maintained membership for at least three consecutive years (current year plus immediate past two years), and who are current on their dues, are eligible to apply for a grant in the wake of a significant financial setback as described above. We had a nice donation of Comfort Items from different Units for our Veterans Hospitals and Nursing Homes. Out of the six Districts we had five Districts, and seventeen Units from these Districts to donate.

This year we had approximately 4,000 items donated for a total of \$9.500.00, stamps totaling \$410.00, checks \$1,300.00, the VFW \$222.81 in socks, for a grand total of \$11,432.81. This will really look good on my report to National.

I would like to thank Margaret Yost, Dortha Parsons, Lynda Lancaster, Peggy Swartz for their help. Junior Auxiliary members Charli Michael, Mary Grace Bannon, and Debi Michael; SAL member Lucius Michael and 2 other SAL Members that came in and donated time. But we cannot forget all the kind people who brought Items for the Comfort Drive and all the members who transported items back to the VA Hospitals and Nursing Homes.
