Mission Statement

In the spirit of service, not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

A new year has started. Membership for 2018-2019 can be processed for renewals August 1, 2018. New members will be processed September 1st. New members will NOT be counted on membership until after September 1st. PUFL's (Paid Up for Life" will be counted in membership now. Target Dates will be on the 15th of each month with the percentages listed in the Department Calendar.

Mandatory Funds: to be a unit in good standing one of the obligations is paying your unit mandatory funds yearly, no later than July 31, 2019. If you are attending Department Convention to be seated as a delegate, then it is 30 days before Convention.

Mandatory Funds are: Bonding, Girls State Project, Education, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppies, and 10% proceeds.

Spirit Articles: for Vice Presidents are due by 16th of each month. Target sheets will be emailed on 15th. Officers and Chairmen are due NO LATER than 17th of each month. If not in by the dates above will not be able to put in Spirit. Please limit your article to 200 words or less. Please do not use a lot of CLIPART for Spirit. Spirit is emailed/mailed by the 20th of each month. If it falls on a weekend then it will be sent on Monday of the next week.

Constitution & Bylaws

What is this program, and Why do we have it?

The Constitution & Bylaws program informs and educates members of the American Legion Auxiliary on the importance and power of properly written, reviewed and updated documents, policies, and procedures at all levels. Constitution & Bylaws are the basis for governance of our department, district, and unit. Preparing and adhering to updated Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules will ensure a more successful organizational process and provide the structures to follow at all levels of our organization.

Do you need to increase your dues because an increase at the National level? If so, where is the dollar amount of your dues listed? If it is in your Standing Rules, congratulations, you will just have to make a Standing Rule change. This can be done at a single meeting. However, if the dollar amount is listed in the constitution or bylaws, you will need to make a constitutional change which involves bring this to your members at several meetings before the vote and usually publicizing in the local newspaper. Consider leaving the fact that your unit charges dues on a yearly basis and moving the dollar amount to Standing Rules.

While the Legion was founded in March of 1919, the Women's Auxiliary was given this name in November of 1919 which was then changed to the American Legion Auxiliary in 1921 at its first national convention.

The American Legion's 100th anniversary celebration will officially begin at its National Convention in August of this year and run through August of 2019.

In contrast, the Auxiliary, founded near the end of 1919, will begin its official kickoff at its 2019 convention and culminate at the 2020 convention. And we have been living our Service not Self motto and our mission for nearly a century.
