Mission Statement

In the spirit of service, not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

<u>Mandatory Funds:</u> to be a unit in good standing one of the obligations is paying your unit mandatory funds yearly, no later than **July 31, 2019**. If you are attending Department Convention to be seated as a delegate, then it is **30 days before Convention.**

Mandatory Funds are: Bonding, Girls State Project, Education, Veterans 1st Fund, Poppies, and 10% proceeds.

Spirit Articles: for Vice Presidents are due by 16th of each month. Target sheets will be emailed on 15th. Officers and Chairmen are due NO LATER than 17th of each month. If not in by the dates above will not be able to put in Spirit. Please limit your article to 200 words or less. Please do not use a lot of CLIPART for Spirit. Spirit is emailed/ mailed by the 20th of each month. If it falls on a weekend then it will be sent on Monday of the next week.

<u>New Department Education</u> Committee for 3 years is Dianne McClung. Dianne is this year's Chairman. Out of 40 voting Executive Board members, 30 ballots were sent back with 30 voting "yes".

Constitution & Bylaws

Your Constitution and Bylaws are the foundation of your organization and contain the guidelines by which your Unit runs. The Constitution states what your organization is and what it does. It describes the membership and eligibility. It tells you what officers you have and how they are chosen, your meetings and committees are generally outlined, and how amendments can be made should be stated. The Bylaws generally contain more specific information on how your Unit functions and how it's governed. What kind of meetings you hold, how often you meet, and what your quorum is may be stated. The duties of the Officers are listed, if dues are collected, and treatment of members noted. More specific information is given on how the elections are held and sometimes the different committees are listed.

The specific amount of dues, special circumstances or guidelines, and other miscellaneous items can be put in your Standing Rules.

The Constitution and Bylaws are usually not changed easily or often. They must conform to National and Department's Constitution and Bylaws. They should be reviewed when changes are made by National or Department to make sure they are in agreement and not in conflict. When you make changes to your Constitution and Bylaws, they should be sent to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee Chairman for review. If they are found to be in agreement with National and Department, they will be signed, sent to the Department Secretary for her signature, and a copy will be filed with her. Your signed Constitution and Bylaws will be returned to your Unit.

I found a nice template online done by the Department of Florida. It is a PDF file and can be printed. However, some things don't apply to us or may be different, so you do need to be careful of what you use. The address is <u>https://alafl.org/</u><u>wp-content/uploads/CB-Sample-</u> template.pdf .
