THE AMERICAN FLAG And the MILITARY FUNERAL

The flag has always played a very important part in a military funeral. The flag is not only an emblem, but also, in its own way, a history of this country. It tells a story of thousands of men and women who have been loyal to their land through suffering and hardship, and who have not hesitated to sacrifice their lives to support the ideals and goals of this great land.

During a military funeral, the flag draping the casket embraces the service men and women who has devoted their life to our country, and who is about to be laid to final rest. At the conclusion of the service, the flag is carefully folded into a tricornered hat, symbolic of hats worn by soldiers who fought the War of the Revolution and won American independence. In the folding, the red and white stripes are finally wrapped into the blue, symbolizing the light of day vanishing into the darkness of night. The flag is then presented to the next of kin on behalf of the President of the United States and a grateful nation.

At each Nations Cemetery, the flag of the United States flies daily in silent vigil over ordered rows of white marble headstones, honoring the lives and deeds of those who answered the call to duty.

Constitution & Bylaws

Motions

(source: ALA National Department Operations Guide)

- 1. Principal Motions: Parliamentary motions fall into four groups, including:
- a. Motions: Brings new propositions before the assembly. They are open to debate and usually require a majority vote to carry them. A motion to rescind is a main motion requiring a 2/3 vote if previous notice has not been given.
- b. Subsidiary Motions: Are attached to other questions for one or more of three purposes:

To modify (amend), to delay action, and to stop debate.

- c. Privileged Motions: These are so important that they may break in at almost any time. Three are quite commonly used: **To take a recess, to adjourn, and to fix a time and place to adjourn.
- d. Incidental motions: These are used to keep the business of an organization moving properly should matters become too complex and confusing. Only two or three are commonly used:
- **Withdrawal of a motion may be asked for by the maker, and if no one objects, withdrawal is allowed. If anyone objects, it is necessary to make a motion to permit its withdrawal.
- **Point of order is made to call attention to a parliamentary mistake.
- **Appeal from the decision of the chair is made if a member disagrees with the presiding officer's decision. The assembly than may vote either to sustain or overrule the chair's decision. An appeal is usually debatable.
 - 2. Steps in a Main Motion
- ·Motion is made, preferably in positive form, by saying, "I move that..."
- ·Motion must be seconded to be considered. At least two (2) people must wish to discuss a topic; therefore, the "second" is the second person. If there is no second, the motion dies.
- ·The chair repeats the motion, which opens the motion for discussion.
- ·Debate/discussion.
- ·Chair repeats the motion when discussion ends or time limit expires.
- ·Chair calls for ayes and nays. Must always call for the negative vote, even if it appears the vote is unanimous.
- ·Chair announces the result of the vote.

Legislative

Hope everyone is enjoying your district conference and gaining new information. There are two topics I want to touch on this month.

With all the recent happenings, things like but not limited to the capital protests, Dr. Seuss, removal of statuses and renaming roadways, the Cadbury Commercial, I want to remind everyone, we are a non-political, non-partisan organization that supports ALL veterans. So when you are writing letters, posting, protesting and so on, you are welcome to your beliefs, and there are freedom of speech etc. laws, but you must do so without use of anything with the American Legion Auxiliary. This includes signing letters with your name and the use of the Auxiliary, you may protect but do not wear Auxiliary pins, hats, clothing, etc. Post on your page as yourself, do not post on organization pages and as the Auxiliary.

In March H.R. 1276 was signed into law. The law allows VA to provide a COVID-19 vaccine to all veterans, their spouses, caregivers, and Civilian Health and Medical Program recipients regardless of their eligibility for VA health care. Veterans who are already using VA health care will have priority, however, all veterans, their spouses and caregivers are now eligible to receive coronavirus vaccines through the Department of Veterans Affairs. Under previous rules, department medical centers were permitted to administer vaccines only to veterans already eligible for VA health care services, and for certain caregivers registered in VA support programs.

The new expands that pool to include:

**All veterans living in the United States:

**Veterans living overseas enrolled in the Foreign Medical Program;

**Those veterans' spouses;

**Veteran caregivers enrolled in either the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers or the Program of General Caregiver Support Services:

**Veteran caregivers enrolled in certain geriatrics and extended Care Programs, such as Veteran Directed Care and VA's Medical Foster Home Program;

**and Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs (CHAMPVA) recipients;

**The spouses of veterans.

Page 31 Article VIII Department Officers

Section 2

Reads As:

The National Executive Committee Woman Shall be the retiring President and the incoming President shall be her alternate.

Shall Read if Approved:

The National Executive Committeeperson (Striking the word "woman" and replacing it with the word "person") shall be an elected member in good standing and shall be held as a 2-Year term.

Rationale

Striking the word "woman" and replacing it with the word "person" brings our Department in line with current ALA National developments.

Changing this office from a designated office of 1 (one) year to an elected office of 2 (two) years allows the NEC to fully focus her/his attention to this office and allows additional time to fully embrace and understand all of the responsibilities and procedures expected while holding the office.

Proposed Chango: Take out a Secretary/Treasurer, a Chaptain, and a Historian

Rationale: Remainder of Article VIII Section 1 moved to Article 10 Elections.

New Reading:

Section 1: The Department Convention shall elect annually a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President.

Under Bylaws: Article X: Utections

Current Reading:

Section 1: The election of the following officers shall be by secret hallot: Department President, Department First Vice President, Department Second Vice President, Department Secretary/Treasurer, Department Chaplain, and Department Historian. A majority of the votes cast shall be necessary to elect. When there is but one candidate for an office, the roll call may be dispensed with the nominee elected by voice vote.

Proposed Change: Department Secretary/Treusurer shall be elected every 3 years.

Rationale: The Department Headquarters is in the home of the Secretary/Treasurer. Therefore it isn't necessary to elect every year.

New Reading:

Section 1: The election of the following officers shall be by secret ballot: Department President, Department First Vice President, Department Second Vice President. The Department Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected every three years. A majority of the votes east shall be necessary to elect. When there is but one candidate for an office, the roll call may be dispensed with the nominee elected by voice vote.

Proposed Change: Under Elections Section 1: delete Department Chaplain and Department Historian.

Rationale: Each year is harder to find a member to run for Department Chaplain and Historian. The newly elected President usually has to appoint someone for these two offices.

New Section 2: The Incoming President shall appoint a Chaplain and a Historian to serve her year.

If passed, then the old Scotion 2 would become Section 3, Section 3 would be Section 4, and so on.
