

The Veterans Welfare Fund is the same as the Love Fund, and Veterans 1st Fund. Just had been renamed over the last few years.

Membership: National is once again honoring our "new" female veterans again this year. Please remember to put "Honor Our Female Veterans" at top of application. If a member is rejoining, I don't need an application sent in. You may want one for your records to make sure she is still eligible. If you do send one in, write either "rejoin" or her ID number on the application so she won't be listed as a new member in the system. Please don't send me the DD214. They are for the unit files only. Post Officer signature is all I need on application to verify the eligibility. All applications sent to the Department Office needs to be the original. Copies are for you to keep.

I will have New Unit Officers forms with me at any District meeting that I attend this spring. Please fill out return and before June 1, 2022. Even if your unit does not change officers I need these forms returned completed. NO EXEMPTIONS!

Note—First District has had to move there spring meeting to May 1st. The meeting will still be held in Chester.

All 2022 dues MUST be paid before back dues are process—if not the Department will pay a processing fee which in turn will be passed on to the units.

I hope you all are as excited for Spring to be around the corner as I am. It is a very busy time of year with "Year-End" Reports as well as upcoming events. I want to give each of you feedback on our recent NEC Mid-Year Conference. We voted on the following measures: 1. To accept the external auditor's report as presented. 2. To consent to be listed as co-sponsor with the National Finance Committee on the dues increase proposal which will be presented and debated at 2022 National Convention. 3. To approve changes to the National Contract and Signature Authority Policy: allows the National Secretary and the Executive Director to enter into Multi-year agreements if it results in a cost-savings, is within the approved budget, the amount is no greater than \$150,000, and there is a no-penalty termination clause. 4. To approve changes to the national Prepaid Expenses Policy: changed the specific example "ALA Girls Nation pin/charms" to the more general "program expenses"; and expenses shall be expensed when paid or when the program, service, or event occurs. 5. To approve the title change of the Solicitation and Acceptance of Donations, Gifts, or Grants Policy to Solicitation and Acceptance of Funds Policy; to include sponsorship as a solicited and acceptable defined fund, and add specifications of acceptable sponsorships. 6. To approve the reviewed Reserve Policy without changes. The policy changes are now updated in the online C&B on MyAuxiliary member portal of the National Website. Flag & Emblem Sales is out of stock of the C&B and will not have more reprints with amended policies until after National Convention. Until next month be safe and God Bless.
