Mission Statement

In the spirit of service, not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

Mandatory Funds: (Unit General Fund)-Bonding (\$5.00), Education (Scholarship), & Girls State Project (any amount the unit can afford);

Unit Welfare Fund - Veterans' Welfare Fund (any amount the unit can afford), & 10% of Poppy Proceeds.

Membership: Award—10 Plus 3 in 2023—Recruit 10 New Senior Members and 3 New Junior members. New members must be entered and paid in ALA-MIS by June 1, 2023. Forms must be received at ALA NHQ by June 3, 2023. One entry per recruiter.

There was a dues increase voted on and passed. This increase will go into effect for the 2024 year. National dues was increase by \$6.00 per diem. This means that units will need to send a total of \$25.00 for National and Department per diem for 2024 year. National will be looking at different ways to cut cost, so another increase will not happen for a couple of years. Units need to increasing their dues for the 2024 year.

Junior members who turn 18 yrs. old before January 1st of 2023 are considered Senior members. Please take notice of their status National has marked on your roster. Do Not change status!

If your unit has old applications with great granddaughters on them, they need to be destroy. Department will return any of the old applications that have been marked great granddaughter. If you need new applications please call or email the office.

Two leadership crisis items to consider...

Ego, Vanity and Arrogance...

We've all heard the expression "Check your ego at the door". That often goes double for leaders. We have also heard there is no "I" in team. You get the idea.

Too often those in positions of leadership make it all about themselves. They are the first to jump in and take credit or insert themselves into the photo op. Resist that when appropriate. Sometimes you need to be that person who steps in and accepts the credit but always remember to do so on behalf of everyone who contributed to the success of the program or project.

The next issue is Deficiency of Self-Awareness - which goes hand-in-hand with the one about Ego, Vanity and Arrogance.

It is so important that we keep ourselves in check. Leaders need to know their followers but they also need to take time to know themselves.

What makes you stand out as a leader? What makes you shine? What needs improvement? What needs to change... or not change?

We must hold ourselves accountable and be aware of how we are perceived by those around us. The age of texting and social media has confused some people's sense of self-awareness. Don't let that happen to you and as you mentor future leaders... teach them to avoid that temptation as well. Think before you speak. Think before you text. And definitely think before you post.

Constitution & Bylaws

We have seen updates from 4 Units and know of a 5th currently working on theirs. If you have questions, please feel free to reach out. If there are topics you would like to see covered in articles, please reach out and let us know.

If your Unit has not updated your Constitution and Bylaws in 4 years you are out of date. In 2018 National changed eligibility to include the male spouse of female veterans. This not only changes eligibility, it also changes all locations where you refer to "she", "her", or "wife".

If your Unit includes when to file your E990, that goes in Standing Rules. Remember all Units should have their own EIN number and file their E990. We do not use the Legion EIN.

In the Unit Guide Book there is a good example layout of the Constitution and Bylaws.


