Mission Statement

In the spirit of service, not Self, the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary is to support The American Legion and honor the sacrifice of those who serve by enhancing the lives of our veterans, military, and their families, both at home and abroad. For God and Country, we advocate for veterans, educate our citizens, mentor our youth, and promote patriotism, good citizenship, peace and security.

<u>Mandatory Funds:</u> (Unit General Fund)- Bonding (\$5.00), Education (Scholarship), & Girls State Project;

Unit Welfare Fund - Veterans' Welfare Fund (any amount your unit can afford), & 10% of Poppy Proceeds.

<u>Membership</u>: Award—10 Plus 3 in 2023—Recruit 10 New Senior Members and 3 New Junior members. New members must be entered and paid in ALA-MIS by June 1, 2023. Forms must be received at ALA NHQ by June 3, 2023. One entry per recruiter.

Those Districts & Units that did not send in officers update for the Directory it is now to late for the Directory. I will include any changes in the Spirit that is forward to Department headquarters.

I would still like to have Unit Chairperson list. This list is given to Department Committee Chairperson, so they can keep in contact with the Units' chairperson. I have extend the deadline to November 1st. Thanks!

National Convention was Great!

There was a dues increase voted on and passed. This increase will go into effect for the 2024 year. National dues was increase by \$6.00 per diem. This means that units will need to send a total of \$25.00 for National and Department per diem for 2024 year. National will be looking at different ways to cut cost, so another increase will not happen for a couple of years. Units need to increasing their dues for the 2024 year.

Spirit renewals are now due for 2023 year!

ALAMIS—Starting in July Unit Full Access will be available to all units with Department approval. You will have the ability to pay membership dues, rejoin former members within your unit, and new members. ALL transfer request of current members, expired members, former members or out of state will still need to be proceeded by the department. Units will need to use a credit or debt card to process membership to National.

If your Unit is currently using the "Write" program and wish to try the "Full", I will need a written letter or email stating such. You will have until January 1st to decide whether you want to keep "Full" or return to "Write".

New pricing will go into effect January 2023—Unit Full \$20.00; Unit Write \$15.00; Unit View \$10.00;

Junior members who turn 18 yrs. old before January 1st of 2023 are considered Senior members. Please take notice of their status National has marked on your roster. Do Not change status!

Americanism

Since we don't have any patriotic holidays this upcoming month, (sorry Columbus Day and Halloween), I've decided to give a little history lesson this time. Does everyone know the history of the Pledge of Allegiance?

The original was written by Francis Bellamy. It was first given wide publicity through the official program of the National Public Schools Celebration of Columbus Day, which was printed in the Youth's Companion of September 8, 1892, and at the same time sent out in pamphlet forms to schools throughout the country. It was first recited by school children this way:

"I pledge allegiance to MY flag and to the Republic for which it stands one Nation indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all"

"My Flag," was replaced with "The flag of the United States," in 1923 because some foreign-born people might have in mind the flag of the country of their birth instead of the American flag. A year later, "of America," was added after "United States."

No form of the Pledge received official recognition by Congress until June 22, 1942, when it was formally included in the U.S. Flag Code. The official name of The Pledge of Allegiance was adopted in 1945. The last change in language came on Flag Day 1954, when congress passed a law, which added the words. "under God" after "one nation." Originally, the pledge was said with the right hand in the so-called "Bellamy Salute," with the right hand resting first outward from the chest, then the arm extending out from the body. Once Adolf Hitler came to power in Europe during WWII, some Americans were concerned that thus position of the arm and hand resembled the Nazi or Fascist salute. I'm 1942, Congress established the current practice of rendering the pledge with the right hand over the heart.

Leadership

As we continue Lighting Up Our Future for our Veterans and enjoy the theme of Christmas EVERYDAY... we need to be sure we are aware of and addressing the crisis of leadership across the country and around the globe. Blame it on the pandemic; blame it on aging membership or blame it on apathy. Whatever you choose to blame it on makes little difference. The way we choose to tackle it and address it is what counts.

In a series of articles, I plan to share five reasons why we are fighting this Leadership Crisis... and I believe together we can find ways to navigate it and work toward a solution.

Reason One: Obsession with Outcomes Outcomes should be the LAST link in whatever it is we are trying to accomplish. We must think about the planning and the process before we focus all our energy and effort on the end result. Certainly, we have to keep that in mind, but as leaders we must be committed to thinking about the cause and effect of programs and projects.

Here's a quick analogy as we enter the fall season: To grow a pumpkin you need four elements – earth, air, fire (warmth) and water – and a seed. During its development, your attention is not on the pumpkin, it's on the four elements that make the growth possible – the environment.

Just like the pumpkin, you have absolutely NO IDEA exactly how a project or program will turn out in terms of form, size, and impact. These are not predictable. The only thing you can control are the parameters of its environment. When leaders fixate only on the outcomes, they do so at the detriment of the casual factors that determine the quality of those outcomes. We simply cannot ignore the process and must be supportive of the "environment" that contributes to bringing things to fruition. We are a group of dedicated women who can and will make a difference. Let's find ways to support one another learn as we grow as leaders and give each other the gift of mutual helpfulness.



Constitution & Bylaws

At National Convention there were 22 items changed in the National governing documents, Constitution, Bylaws, Standing Rules and Incorporation. I will summarize those changes here and only expand on a few. They are listed in order presented at the National Convention. Not all of these will be of interest to every member, but I wanted to cover each one so those who need to be aware are. Please feel free to reach out with any questions.

Constitution Article VII & Bylaws Article XIII.- add date, so the purposed amendments are received by the Monday after the 3rd Friday in July and clarified how they get distributed.

Standing Rule VII. Committees, 6 – (AEF, Girls Nation, Community Service, Education, Junior, Leadership, Legislation, Membership Poppy and Public Relations) added the Committee Purpose.

Standing Rule XIII. Dues, 1 – For Fiscal year 2024, the National portion of the Dues will increase from \$12 to \$18 per senior member. (Department is staying at \$7, so instead of sending \$19, Units will send \$25. So before to check your Unit dues amount and if you need to increase them be sure to change it in your Standing rules if needed)

Standing Rule VII. Committees, 6. Risk & Compliance -Added an additional member independent of the organization may be selected by the Risk & Compliance Committee from applicants with demonstrated experience in nonprofit risk and compliance.

Bylaw Article II. Election of Officers Section 4 – added Appointment to title and removed NEC and National committee from section 4. Also added if a National committee member is an ALA member, they shall be in good standing in their Unit.

Bylaws Article VIII. Department Organization, Section 2- Added if a Department Officer is an ALA member, they shall be in good standing in their Unit.

Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation – to handle items related to NEC to oversee NEC conduct.

Bylaws Article IV, National Executive Committee, Section 2. Authority to include conduct of all NEC members and possible outcomes of misconduct.

National Standing Rule VII. Committees, 6, Special Purpose Committees– Purpose and composition of Ethical Conduct Committee

Standing Rules X. Departments, 5 regarding the conduct of NEC member - Conduct of the NEC member is now addressed in Bylaws IV, National Executive Committee, Section 2, and in the Ethical Conduct Review Policy, so those parts were removed here. However, election, eligibility, and capacity are still matters to be determined by the NEC member's department, responsibility added. Item "e" conflicts with Standing Rule X. #2, so it was removed here.

Bylaws Article XI. Suspension, Cancellation and Revocation of Charters – was reworked due to - A special subcommittee of the NEC that was formed this past administrative year to review an appeal from a Unit on the cancellation of its charter, identified changes that needed to be made to the bylaws regarding Unit cancellations; the Department charter cancellation process also is updated for consistency.

1. The terms "suspend," "cancel" and "revoke" were not defined and confusing. "Suspending" a Unit means the Unit must cease operations for a defined period of time. This does not allow the Unit to make any changes recommended by the Department. For example, Departments may choose to discipline a Unit for a probationary period and require tasks to be accomplished in a specified time frame for the Unit to be reinstated in good standing. This will be described more fully in the standing rules. The term "revocation" is most often associated by our members with IRS revocation of tax-exempt status.

2. The terms "due process" and "equal protection" are legal terms enforced by courts. Also, Indiana state statutes do not require a "hearing." Non-profit organizations are using the more easily understood term" fundamental fairness" which is defined as notice and an opportunity to be heard.

3. Court reporters are expensive and rarely used. Departments should instead preserve all disciplinary communications with the unit, including meetings and actions taken by the Department. More details are to be included in the standing rules.

4. Eliminating and simplifying references where multiple words are used to the same effects: for example, changing "possession, custody, and control" to possession.
