# Americanism

National Pledge of Allegiance Day is celebrated on December 28 to commemorate the adoption of the Pledge of Allegiance into the United States Flag Code by Congress in 1945. The Pledge of Allegiance, originally written by Francis Bellamy in 1892, has undergone several changes, including the addition of the words "under God" in 1954 during the Cold War. The day serves as a reminder of the patriotic values and principles that the Pledge represents, such as liberty, justice and unity. It also highlights the historical significance of the Pledge in American Culture and its role in fostering national unity and patriotism. For many of us, the Pledge of Allegiance was something we knew by heart and recited each morning in school. With our right hands over our hearts and our eyes cast upward at the flag on the wall, we were taught to show our patriotism.

Congress formally adopted the Pledge in 1942. One of the more significant changes occurred by 1954 when President Eisenhower asked Congress to add the controversial phrase "under God" to the text. This was an effort to differentiate the American way in communist times.



# West Virginia American Legion Auxiliary Department Scholarship 2024-2025 Education and Scholarship Grant

# Purpose

To assist direct descendants of West Virginia Veterans, who are in need, to attend college or a school of higher education.

# Description

The Department of West Virginia shall award four (4) scholarship grants annually to applicants who meet specific criteria. Each grant of \$500.00 per academic grant must be used for the payment of tuition and necessary fees only. The scholarship grant must be renewed annually with a letter of enrollment and cannot exceed a total of four awards—or a total of \$2,000.00

When a scholarship recipient (s) fails to renew his/her award (leaving that scholarship grant open), the \$500.00 scholarship grants (s) may be awarded to another qualified applicant.

# Eligibility

Applicant must be a resident of West Virginia, under 22 years of age when applying for first grant. Must be a high school graduate or in graduating class when applying.

Must demonstrate financial need in order to qualify.

Must achieve qualifying score on Scholastic Aptitude Test for the College Entrance Examination Board of West Virginia Colleges except if the applicant wishes to pursue some other career such as Beauty Culture, Nursing, etc.

Must have 16 credits of A, B, or C grades in last five (5) semesters of high school and must maintain a "C" average to be considered for renewal of grant. Copies of grade transcripts must be submitted to Department Scholarship Chairman each year to be considered for renewal.

# **Application Procedure**

- Application must be submitted prior to March 1, 2025 to Unit President or Unit Scholarship Chairman for thorough investigation as to actual financial need before presenting to Department for consideration.
- A certified transcript or photocopy of the applicant's high school grades.
- Be prepared to submit a Parent's Confidential Financial Statement as evidence of financial need.
- 4. Apply for admission to college or university of your choice in state of West Virginia Only.
- 5. A copy of ACT or SAT tests scores.
- A brief statement of the military service a direct descendant, including the branch of service and dates of service, or a photocopy of discharge papers.
