

The ON-LY time that the unit secretary can sign an application is when a female veteran is joining under herself—No Exceptions! Applications will be returned.

Reminder—Constitution Article VIII, section 4—All Department officers, Department Executive Committee and Chairmen of Standing must be in good standing in their Units. Dues shall be paid to Department by **November 1st**.

Just a small note; Posts and Units may meet on the same day. They just do not hold their business sessions together.

Caregivers be awarded Service to Veterans hours which may accumulate for hour bars for time spent providing care and assistance to veterans within their families if they do not receive PROFESSIONAL compensation for doing so. If the caregiver lives with the veteran, they may be awarded 10 hours a week. If they do NOT live with the veteran, then they may be awarded 5 hour a week. This does not include things like cutting you and your spouses lawn, or cleaning your house. That is part of your responsibility. Now, if your veteran spouse or parent requires help bathing, and feeding, then yes you may count the above number of hours.

We are still in warm weather, before it gets cold, consider outside activities with veterans, things like honor flights, a small fishing trip, or just a quite talk in the shade. However, as we move towards cooler temperatures, start planning on supporting homeless veterans with blankets, mats, canned food, costs, gloves, and hats. Don't wait till it's bitter cold! 


