

Please if you haven't looked at your governing documents in the last three years you should have your unit governing documents committee review them. Also National is hoping

Article III, Membership Section 6, in the Constitution reads:

Section 6. Membership can only be offered upon an affirmative vote of the unit members. Unless an alternate procedure is set forth in the unit bylaws.

This means Units must vote on members coming into their Unit, new or transfers, unless the Unit Bylaws state how new and/or transfers are accepted. If the Unit does not vote, the acceptance process must be in the Unit Bylaws.

There is a whole section on Discipline, you might want to review as well.

Fellow Auxiliary Members,

When used properly, portable and standby generators are a great option to provide backup power during power outages. In order to use them properly and safely though please do the following: Always keep generators at least 20 feet away from your home. Never operate a generator in an enclosed space. Make sure the generator has 3-4 feet of clear space above and on all sides for proper ventilation. Keep generators away from doors, windows, and vents. And always direct exhaust away from your home.

Eisenhower sitting in Lincoln's pew, Docherty, the church's pastor, delivered a sermon based on the Gettysburg Address entitled "A New Birth of Freedom." He argued that the nation's might lay not in arms but rather in its spirit and higher purpose. He noted that the Pledge's sentiments could be those of any nation: "There was something missing in the pledge, and that which was missing was the characteristic and definitive factor in the American way of life." He cited Lincoln's words "under God" as defining words that set the US apart from other nations.

One Nation under God, not One Nation, under God. There is a difference.
