I hope everyone is ready for the holidays.


I would like to congratulate Buckhannon for reaching 100% goal. Way to go!!

Michelle Powell Constitution and Bylaws Chairman 304-639-5379 Let's try to clear up some confusion. Michelle Powell is the **Department Constitution and Bylaw Chairman.** Unit changes go to Michelle. I am the **NEC**, (National Executive Committee) I share information to Units in the Department that comes from National. During National Convention, several changes to the Constitution, Bylaws & Standing Rules, that impact our Units were made. I shared that information with you. Michelle may as well.

If you recall one of my earlier articles, talked about Units filing E990's and being in Compliance with National. That was unrelated to changes to Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules. However, does touch the area, because it's required to be in compliance.

In recent years National has made lots of changes to their governing documents, so it's always good to keep informed with what effects your Unit and make the necessary changes so your Unit is in Compliance with National.

Carbon Monoxide (CO) Poisoning Prevention: When using generators, improper use and installation of generators could cause CO poisoning. Make sure your home has carbon monoxide alarms outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. CO can kill in as little as 5 minutes. Symptoms of CO poisoning include dizziness, headaches, nausea and tiredness. If you experience CO poisoning symptoms, get fresh air, do not reenter area and call 911.


