If you have any questions or need assistance, feel free to reach out. Stay safe and warm—I look forward to seeing everyone at midwinter.



American Flag Etiquette

1-The Flag should be raised "Briskly" and lowered "Ceremoniously"

2-It's customary to only display the flag from sunrise to sunset, you can display for 24hrs if properly illuminated at night by a light

3-The Flag should never touch anything beneath it, Means no ground, floor, water

4-When the flag is displayed against a wall the union (AKA stars) should be situated to the uppermost left corner, same goes when it's displayed in a window

5-Unless your flag is labeled all-weather, it should not be displayed in inclement weather

6-ONLY display the Flag union down in time of distress, extreme danger to life

7-When the Flag is flown half-staff, raise to peak then lower back down to half-staff, when lowering the flag, raise back to peak then lower for the day.

8-Always let the flag be aloft and free, you can carry to display area

9-Stars and stripes should not be draped over the hood, sides, top or back of a vehicle, or railroad train or boat

The newsletter contains important information about available scholarships.</p> <p>Every year, the National offers various gift scholarships for students enrolled in accredited colleges, universities, or trade schools. Your help sharing details about the \$182,000 in scholarship funds for eligible applicants is greatly appreciated.</p> <p>Some of these scholarships need letters of recommendation and proof of military service, so students should start gathering the required documents early. Holiday breaks are an excellent time to prepare applications and avoid rushing near the deadline.</p> <p>Among our 52 departments, one student from each division will receive a \$5,000 scholarship, and an additional 47 departments will award \$1,000 scholarships. To be eligible, applicants must be current or former Junior members with three consecutive years of membership (2023–2025) and maintain active status through 2026. 
Lisa served as District Chairman for Americanism, Constitution & Bylaws, and National Security off and on over the years and served as 10th District Vice President during 2008-2009.
